Internet access at the conference venue

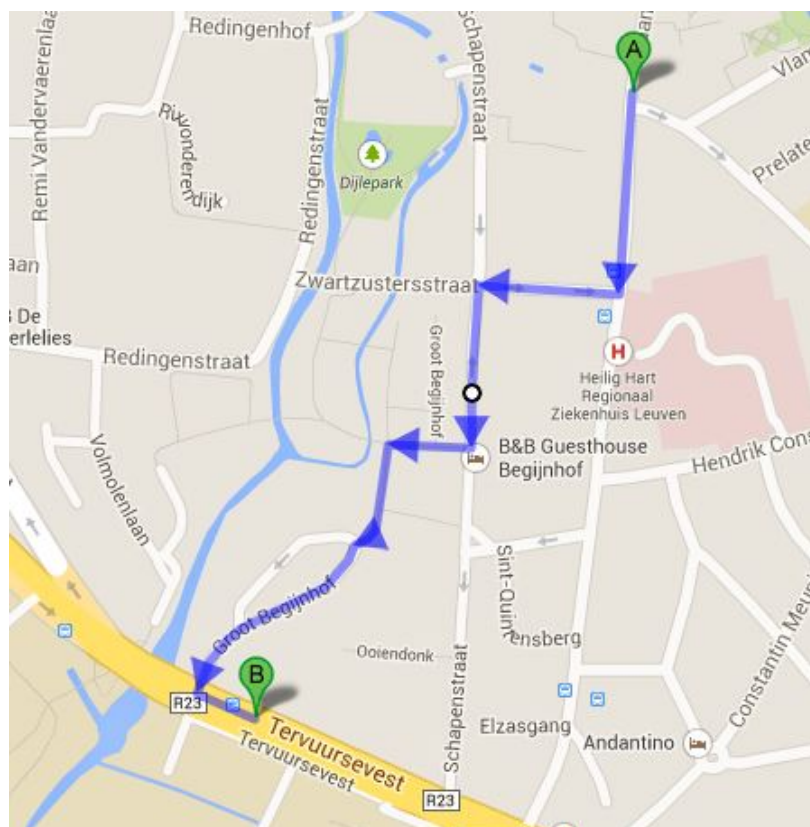
